

MTH 103 FALL 2019
ALLOWED AND NOT ALLOWED GRAPHING CALCULATORS

A scientific calculator and/or a *basic* graphing calculator (such as the TI-83, TI-84, or TI-86) is required for this course. Graphing calculators such as the TI-89, TI-Nspire, that can perform symbolic calculations and use a computer algebra system are **not allowed** during exams and quizzes. Calculators that can connect to a wireless network are not allowed either.

A scientific calculator costs approximately \$10; it has buttons that say ln, log, sin, cos, etc and does not have the ability to graph.

Graphing calculators are more expensive at approximately \$45-\$100, but you will be required to have one in the next applied course MTH 131. If you intend to take that course in one of the coming semesters, it is recommended to make the investment to obtain one now and get comfortable with using it (if you are not already).

Below is a short list of acceptable graphing calculators and a short list of those which are not allowed. There are many different models of graphing calculators out there. If you do not see your model listed here and you are unsure if it is approved for use in MTH 103, consult your instructor for verification.
